## 1. <u>PURPOSE</u>

1.1. The City of San Diego Commission for Arts and Culture (*Commission*) administers the *Public Art Fund* into which in-lieu *Civic Enhancement allocations* are deposited. This instruction is used to guide the distribution of in-lieu *Civic Enhancement allocations* from the *Public Art Fund*.

## 2. <u>SCOPE</u>

2.1. The scope of this instruction is limited to guiding the distribution of in-lieu *Civic Enhancement allocations* from the *Public Art Fund*.

## 3. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

3.1. Italicized terms used in this instruction have the same definitions as provided in <u>San Diego</u> <u>Municipal Code (SDMC) section 26.0702</u>.

## 4. <u>POLICY</u>

- 4.1. <u>General</u>
  - 4.1.1. Source of In-Lieu Civic Enhancement Allocations: Pursuant to <u>SDMC sections</u> <u>26.0714 to 26.0721</u>, certain *development* projects meet the City of San Diego's (City) *Civic Enhancement allocation* requirement and developers of such eligible projects may opt to pay a fee equaling half of one percent (0.5%) of the *total building permit valuation* in lieu of spending one percent (1%) for *artworks* on the *premises* or one percent (1%) for space for *cultural use* on the *premises*. The fees, also known as in-lieu *Civic Enhancement allocations* are received by the City at intervals that are dependent solely on choices made by the developer of each eligible *development*. Each in-lieu *Civic Enhancement allocation* is individually tracked and should be completely expended within five (5) years from the date of payment, though this does not prohibit the pooling of the in-lieu fees for the purpose of expending in-lieu *Civic Enhancement allocations*.
  - 4.1.2. Use of In-Lieu Civic Enhancement Allocations: Pursuant to SDMC 20.0714 Civic Enhancement allocations, including in-lieu Civic Enhancement allocations, are intended to offset the City's increasing urbanization with the creation of artworks and venues dedicated to cultural use. In other words, this funding is intended to be applied to the enhancement of San Diego's public spaces through the exhibition of artworks and the creation or adaptation of venues for the presentation of visual, performing and/or language arts.
  - 4.1.3. Authorized Use of In-Lieu Civic Enhancement Allocations: In-lieu Civic Enhancement allocations shall be expended on projects for:

- b. The slate of projects developed by *Commission* staff will include information about siting, stakeholders, cost, timing and other relevant details.
- c. The slate of projects developed by *Commission* staff will be presented to the *Commission* for feedback, prioritization and recommendation. The *Commission* may require that the Public Art Committee, as well as other standing or ad hoc committees of the *Commission*, receive the slate of projects for feedback, prioritization and recommendation prior to review by the *Commission*. Meetings of the *Commission* and its standing committees are public forums and, therefore, opportunities for members of the public to give input.
- d. The *Commission* will provide feedback, prioritization and recommendation of the projects considering the following factors:
  - i. Degree to which the equitable distribution of benefits to each City Council District can be achieved over time
- ii. Degree to which alignment with priorities set forth in the City's plans (e.g. City Strategic Plan, General Plan, Community Plans, Public Art Master Plan, etc.) can be achieved
- iii. Degree to which the following goals of civic enhancement (as inspired in part by the City's Strategic Plan, General Plan and Public Art Master Plan) can be achieved:
  - Activation, which means:
    - Introducing dynamic features or improving the size, range and frequency of activities that occur in public spaces
    - Enlivening underutilized spaces
    - Attracting people to gather
    - Catalyzing change
    - Enhancing safety and comfort with features such as lighting
    - Providing experiences of discovery, surprise, delight and wonder
  - Creativity, which means:
    - · Inspiring new ideas, exchanges, questions and solutions
    - Showcasing artistic talent
    - Demonstrating advancements in exploration and resourcefulness
    - Strengthening the city as a place for innovative thinking and creative energy
  - Connectivity, which means:
    - Stimulating connection between people, culture and nature
