FIREFIGHTERS AND THE AMERICAN RED CROSS PARTNERING TO SAVE LIVES

San Diego – As part of the commitment to community engagement in the neighborhoods we serve, the San Diego Fire-Rescue Department has partnered with the American Red Cross for its first ever blood drive.

"We look forward to this event as a way to bring attention to the vital issue of blood donation. It's another way we proudly serve our community members," said Chief Brian Fennessy. "The American Red Cross is an excellent partner in this effort."

Blood collected at this drive can help ensure cancer and surgery patients, trauma victims and others have the blood products they need.

Each donor will receive a gift from the American Red Cross. In addition, donors will be eligible for an opportunity drawing with prizes from the Burn Institute (smoke alarms) and San Diego State University (Aztec football jerseys and Pumphrey bobble-head dolls) while supplies last.
